Message from Mayor Wayne Jett:

This past May, I took an oath to represent and serve the citizens of McHenry. A little over four months have passed since I have been in office, and I would like to highlight a few projects currently underway in the city.

The City Council awarded a \$1 million Street Resurfacing contract to Peter Baker & Son. Work is underway on Centegra Drive, Medical Center Drive, Lawrence Parkway, Ridgeview Drive, Curran Road between Bull Valley Road and north of Dartmoor Drive, and Dartmoor Drive between Curran Road and the Boone Creek.

Construction has begun on the new Charles Miller Riverfront Park Public Boat Launch. The total project cost is \$225,000 and paid for using Park Developer Donations.

The McHenry Downtown Theater project is underway and on track to open in late fall. New screens, projectors and high-end seating along with DC Cobbs restaurant and rooftop dining will be a destination enjoyed by the entire community.



Community Development

CODE ENFORCEMENT AND BEING A GOOD NEIGHBOR!

One of the many functions of the Community Development Department is to receive and act upon complaints that are called into our office. One of the complaints we most often receive relates to the outside storage of refuse containers. As the fall and winter seasons approach, there are ways we can be good neighbors and keep our community looking good. One way is to follow the Municipal Code and keep refuse containers out of sight of the public view. According to the McHenry Municipal Code, "No person shall place any garbage and refuse container adjacent to any street, alley, or other public place more than 24 hours prior to the regular and customary collection schedule established by such person's

scavenger, nor shall any person permit such garbage and refuse containers to remain adjacent to any street, alley or other public place more than 24 hours after the aforesaid regular and customary collection schedule. At all other times such garbage and refuse containers shall be stored out of public's plain view." This ordinance is in place to help our neighborhoods remain beautiful, safe and healthy places to live. We ask that you please do your part, and always take in your refuse containers after your garbage has been collected, and to store your containers out of sight of public view. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.





BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR!

A reminder for the upcoming fall season, that the burning of leaves is prohibited in the City of McHenry. Being a good neighbor is more than just helping someone in need. It is also helping to make sure we are respectful to our neighbors. The smoke that is emitted during the burning of leaves can be extremely harmful and dangerous to those people who suffer from health problems, ranging from asthma to chronic heart and lung diseases. The City's burning ordinance prohibits burning leaves. We ask for your assistance in this regard, and thank you in advance for being a respectful neighbor!



Christmas is a time for decorating your home, and what better way to do it safely than to follow these few simple tips!

- Always inspect light sets, lighted figurines and other electrical items for damage to insulation, cords or plugs before use.
- Do not mount or support light sets in a manner that will damage or cut the wire insulation.
- Do not place lights or other heat generating items near flammable materials or metal. The heat can ignite flammable materials and cause metal to heat up.
- Do not plug in more light sets in a single outlet than are recommended by the manufacturer.
- Use caution with extension cords. For example, extension cords rated for use indoors should NOT be used outdoors!
- Holiday decorations should not be installed more than 45 days prior to the holiday and must be removed within 45 days after the holiday.
- Remember to always turn off all your lighted decorations when you are not home.



On March 24th, 2017, Derek Schmidt was sworn in as a Probationary McHenry Police Officer. Derek is a life-long McHenry resident and a U.S. Marine Corps Veteran.

NALOXONE TRAINING

In February 2017, the McHenry Police Department partnered with the McHenry County Mental Health Board and CENTEGRA Health System to better address the ongoing opioid crisis occurring nationwide. Centegra Health System provided naloxone (Narcan) nasal spray training for all officers of the McHenry Police Department and provides a point of distribution of Narcan, which is funded by the McHenry County Mental Health Board.

Narcan[™] (naloxone) is a prescription medicine that blocks the effects of morphine, codeine, oxycodone, methoadone and Vicodin, and reverses an overdose. It cannot be used to get a person high. If given to a person who has not taken opioids, it will not have any effect on him or her, since there is no opioid overdose to reverse.

Since the beginning of the 2017 year, McHenry officers have dispensed Narcan on five separate occasions to individuals experiencing an opioid overdose.




MCHENRY POLICE PREPARE FOR CALEA RE-ACCREDITATION

In 2006, the McHenry Police Department became the first accredited police agency in McHenry County. Since then, the Department has strived to maintain its excellence through re-accreditation. In December McHenry Police will be assessed to achieve its fifth consecutive re-accreditation award through the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement (CALEA).

The successful re-accreditation of the McHenry Police has proven that the McHenry Police Department has followed the goals set by CALEA:

- Strengthen crime prevention and control capabilities;
- Formalize essential management procedures;
- Establish fair and nondiscriminatory personnel practices;
- Improve service delivery;
- Solidify interagency cooperation and coordination; and
- Increase community and staff confidence in the agency.

A REMINDER ABOUT VARIOUS WAYS TO PAY YOUR WATER SEWER BILL, PARKING TICKET OR ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE INVOICES TO THE CITY

Besides paying by cash or check, we also offer other options for making payments. Want to avoid paying late fees? One way to avoid that is to sign up for direct debit for your water/sewer bill payment. To sign up, you can either come into our office and complete a form, or print a form from the City website www.ci.mchenry.il.us. On the website, go to the Permits, Applications and Forms tab on the right side of our homepage then scroll down to Utility Debit Authorization. Please note we do need a voided

blank check attached to the form. When you receive your water bill, it will look as it normally does however it will have "DO NOT PAY" printed across it. The amount due will be automatically debited from your account on the bill due date.



If you would like to make a Water Sewer Bill, Parking Ticket, or any Accounts Receivable invoice payments, you can also use our website. Go to the On-line Payment tab on the right side of our homepage. Click either Utility Bill, Parking Ticket or Accounts Receivable, and follow the prompts; you will need your water sewer account number, parking ticket number, or, if you're paying an Accounts Receivable invoice, you will need your customer number and invoice number. It is very user friendly, and your payment will show on the site immediately. We post payments made on the website daily.

2017 FALL HYDRANT FLUSHING PROGRAM

The City will begin its Fall hydrant flushing operation throughout the City on September 18th, for a two week period ending September 29th. Should a delay arise, the flushing operation will be completed the week of October 2, 2017. Hydrant flushing is necessary to clean and maintain the water distribution system. During the flushing period water can become discolored. If this occurs, run your cold water tap for a few minutes until the water clears. If this does not correct the problem, wait approximately an hour and try again. Do not run your hot water until the cold water tap has cleared. This discoloration is not hazardous to human consumption; however, clothing can become stained during laundering. WATER METER CHANGE OUT PROGRAM



The City of McHenry is currently conducting a meter change out program. Some of the meter reading infrastructure has reached its useful life, and batteries used within the equipment are beginning to fail. Residences that are affected by this program in the Winding Creek, Whispering Oaks, Cooney Heights, and Park Ridge Estates subdivisions will be receiving door hangers. Please make every

attempt to schedule an appointment within five days of receiving the door hanger. Meter personnel have a small amount of meters to change out in the Lakeland Park, Legend Lakes, and Boone Creek Subdivisions. Please call the Public Works Department at 815-363-2186 to set up an appointment.

REFUSE AND RECYCLING COLLECTION CHANGES

The new contract with Prairieland Disposal for refuse and recycling collection services began on August 1, 2017 and will affect single-family and multi-family dwellings (four or less units per dwelling).

STICKER BUY-BACK:

The Waste Management buyback for unused garbage and yardwaste stickers will be held at the Municipal Center (333 S. Green Street) Monday through Saturday from 8:00 am until noon beginning on July 31st. Waste Management personnel will be at the Municipal Center from July 31st through August 12th to accept unused stickers and provide residents with forms to fill out for a refund check. Forms for refund checks will still be available at City Hall until September 30th. The refund checks will take 6-8 weeks to process.

- Curbside leaf collection the first full week of October through the first full week of December
- Christmas tree pick begins January 2nd and ends January 12th.
- A suspension of cart rental is available for people who are leaving their residence for one month to three months at a time.
- There is a free drop-off site for e-waste, textile, gym shoes, Christmas lights, white goods, automotive and rechargeable batteries at the Prairieland Disposal Facility located at 21N988 Pepper Road, Lake Barrington, Illinois (including one television per year per resident)

2017 YARDWASTE PROGRAMS

Curbside Collection will end December 8th. Residents may use 2-ply, 50# kraft paper bags or garbage type cans not to exceed 33 gallons in size with maximum weight of 50 lbs. per container. Containers should be marked with a large X. Affix pre-paid sticker to each bag or can. No plastic bags allowed. Residents can purchase stickers at the Municipal Center or locations throughout the city. Branches must be bundled to maximum length of 4 feet, maximum 2 feet in diameter, and maximum 50 pounds per bundle also with pre-paid sticker attached to each.

- Acceptable Materials grass clippings, leaves, branches 3" in diameter or less, brush, garden plants, flowers, weeds, bark pieces, pine cones.
- Materials Not Allowed tree trunks & stumps, branches larger than 3" in diameter, fence posts, railroad ties, firewood, rocks, sod or dirt.
- To make the containers more visible, please mark containers with a large YW or X.

Drop-Off Facility located at Knox Park is open Saturdays from 7 AM to Noon until December 9th. Vehicle used to transport material must display a current city vehicle sticker. Yard waste may either be in a 2-ply, 50# kraft paper bags or garbage type cans. Plastic bags are allowed only if untied and taken home with the resident. This program is free.

- Acceptable Materials grass clippings, leaves, branches 3" in diameter or less, brush, garden plants, flowers, weeds, bark pieces, pine cones.
- Branches must be bundled to a maximum of 2 feet in diameter and a maximum of 50 pounds per bundle.
- Branches must be bundled to a maximum length of 4 feet, a maximum.
- Materials Not Allowed tree trunks & stumps, branches larger than 3" in diameter, fence posts, railroad ties, firewood, rocks, sod or dirt.

FALL BRUSH PICKUP PROGRAM CHANGE

The City of McHenry's Fall Brush Pickup Program will begin on October 2, 2017 for the entire City. Please be aware of the changes being implemented in the program. There will no longer be designated weeks for the different areas of the City. Beginning on October 2nd, the crews will visit each street once and continue until they have gone through the entire City. No callbacks will be made.

Note: This program is for tree material only; yardwaste belongs in the Yardwaste Collection Program provided by the City of McHenry's waste hauler. When placing branches at the curb, make sure they are not in the street and that all branches are as long as possible and no more than 5 inches in diameter. Residents are advised to place their brush on the parkway parallel to the street no later than October 2nd at 7:00 a.m. This program is intended for larger tree branches resulting from trimming or storm damage. No stumps or roots will be taken. The program is for residential properties only.

FALL LEAF COLLECTION PROGRAM

The City's Refuse and Recycling Program provides for a special leaf collection program beginning October 2nd and ending December 8th. Prairieland Disposal will perform this service utilizing specially designed vacuum equipment. Collections will generally be made the same day as refuse collections. Schedules may be delayed during periods of heavy rain.

Rake leaves to be collected into piles alongside the roadway or between the roadway and sidewalk within 4 feet of roadway edge or curbing. Do not rake leaves onto the roadway. Do not place piles of leaves in drainage ditches.

In addition, please note that cars cannot be parked in the roadway when collections are made. The contractor must have clear access to the curb line or roadside to properly collect leaves, thank you for your cooperation.

POOL DRAINING TIPS TO PROTECT WATER QUALITY

With fall right around the corner, numerous McHenry area residents will be preparing their swimming pools for the winter. Prior to winterizing or draining your pool, the water must be checked for chemicals and additives. Follow these tips to properly drain your pool and protect our community's water resources.

If possible, it is best to allow the water to drain onto your landscape. This recycles the pool water, conserves irrigation water, and avoids environmental risks associated with draining your pool to the street. When pool water is drained to the street, it can carry pollutants such as grease, sediment, trash, harmful additives and chemicals into the storm drain, nearest creek, pond or Fox River. If the water is not properly treated to remove these chemical pollutants, they can cause further damage to the health of our waterways and to plants and animals. For chlorine pools, chlorine levels must be lowered to less than 1 part per million prior to draining. This can be done naturally by allowing the pool water to sit in the sun for a minimum of three days. Alternatively, de-chlorination kits can be purchased at pool supply stores that contain what you need to reach appropriate chlorine levels prior to draining your pool to the curb and gutter.

Before draining the water to the street, sweep the curb and gutter between the discharge point from your yard to the storm drain downhill from your home. This will remove any pollutants from the gutter that may be carried into the storm drain.



MAILBOX POLICY

The homeowner will be responsible for the repair and replacement of the mailbox and post if it is damaged or knocked down by the snow coming off of the plow, (the windrow) and not the direct hit from the city plow.


If your mailbox is damaged by a direct hit from the city plow:

- It will be repaired or replaced with a standard rural steel mailbox unit and posts will be replaced with a 4x4 wooden post.
- The City is not responsible for any cost of repair or replacement in excess of \$50.00 for damage to mailbox. All reimbursements will be made only with the presentation of sales receipts for materials used in such repair and replacement of the mailbox.
- All labor costs to install the mailbox will be the responsibility of the owner.

Curbside mailboxes in the city right of way will be mounted on a wooden post no smaller than 4 inches by 4 inches and firmly secured in the ground. Use of masonry columns and structures erected on the parkway to protect mailboxes such as large boulders, steel beams, concrete or brick structures, or similar devices are prohibited. Mailboxes and support structures will be installed within but no closer than 6 to 8 inches from the edge of the street pavement or the back of the street curb if a curb exists. The bottom surface of the mailbox cannot be less than 41 inches and not more than 45 inches from the ground as illustrated in Figure 1:

Curbside mailboxes and support structures cannot be installed within 10 feet of the point of curvature at any street intersection as illustrated in Figure 2.

This ordinance is located in the City of McHenry Municipal Code, Section 1, Chapter 21, Article VII, Sec. 21-120 "Damaged Mailboxes" and can be viewed on the City website www.ci.mchenry.il.us.



WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT CONSOLIDATION UPDATE



In January of 2016 construction began on an addition to the South Wastewater Treatment Plant to replace the aging Central Wastewater Treatment Plant located on Waukegan Rd. A regional pump station is being built to direct the flow from Central to the South Plant. The underground pipeline that connects the regional pump station and the treatment plant has been completed. The remainder of the construction is expected to be completed by December 2017.

Electricians continue pulling wires into place and making the necessary connections. Pipefitters have been fabricating and installing the stainless steel process piping and most of the larger pieces of equipment are put in place. All the exterior brickwork on the buildings has been completed.

Upgrades to the South Wastewater Treatment Plant will be put into service in stages over the next few months. Residents and businesses will see no disruption or change in their sanitary sewer service.

By the end of 2017 all of the City's wastewater treatment will be consolidated into the South Wastewater Treatment Plant located at 3200 Charles J Miller Rd.


CALL PUBLIC WORKS FIRST

If you are experiencing a sewer backup, contact the Public Works Department at 815-363-2186 during the hours of 7:00 am to 3:30 pm or after 3:30 pm, call the non-emergency police phone number at 815-363-2200, before

you call a plumber. Public Works personnel will be sent to your location to assess the problem. If the blockage is in the City's sewer main line, the City will take corrective action as quickly as possible. If the blockage is in your line (that portion from the building to the sewer main line), you will be requested to call a

plumber to clear your building's service. In this instance, all necessary repairs and restoration are the responsibility of the homeowner.

WATERMAIN BREAKS


Each year the freezing and thawing temperatures can cause watermain breaks. If you should see water coming out of the ground that is not normal for the area, or feel that something else might be happening with regard to watermain breaks, please call:

MONDAY – FRIDAY BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 7 AM & 3:30 PM CALL 815-363-2186

AFTER HOURS, HOLIDAYS & WEEKENDS CALL POLICE NON-EMERGENCY

AT 815-363-2200.

At times, it may become necessary to shut off water service to residents in order to repair a watermain break. When possible, residents are notified prior to having their water turned off. Public Works crews will work around the clock to repair the break and get your water back in service. Areas around a watermain break can freeze during cold weather, so proceed with caution on roadways and sidewalks. If icy conditions exist, please call the phone number listed above. Excavation is required to repair the watermain break. If you have an excavated area near your home, do not attempt to fill in the site. The City will leave the site in a safe manner and will return to repair the area in the spring when the ground has thawed. Should the restored area around a previous break settle, please call for a crew to come out.



STORM DAMAGE PICKUP CRITERIA

The City will pick up storm damage only if it has fallen as the result of a "High Wind Warning" storm event as described by the National Weather Service Chicago Weather Forecast Office. This weather is described as an event that has sustained winds of 40 mph or greater and gusts of 58 mph or greater. If a weather event has winds at or in excess of these speeds, residents may call Public Works within one week to make an arrangement to have the branches picked up.

Residents can visit the National Weather Service's website at www.weather.gov to find out whether an event qualifies as a "High Wind Warning" or has wind speeds at or greater than mentioned at any time. The page that opens will indicate if a "High Wind Warning" was issued. This is how the City will determine whether an event is a "storm."

If the event was not a "storm," residents who do not have a landscape service should follow the Prairieland Disposal guidelines for Yardwaste Pickup or Yardwaste Drop-off.

Prairieland Guidelines Are As Follows:

YARDWASTE PICK-UP:

- Branches must be bundled to a maximum length of 4 feet, a maximum of 2 feet in diameter and a maximum of 50 pounds per bundle and must also have a prepaid yardwaste sticker attached to each bundle.
- This program begins the first full week of April and ends the first full week of December on your regular garbage collection day.

YARDWASTE DROP-OFF:

- All branches must be bundled to a maximum length of 4 feet, a maximum of 2 feet in diameter and a maximum of 50 pounds per bundle.
- This program is held on Saturdays from 7:00 a.m. until noon beginning the first full of week of April and ending in the first full week of December.

Please remember it is unlawful to deposit or cause to be deposited snow and ice from private property on or against a fire hydrant, public sidewalk, roadway or public loading and unloading areas.

The City encourages all residents to remove accumulations of snow and ice from public sidewalks adjacent to their homes and property within 24 hours after the accumulation of snow and ice began. The cleaning of snow makes it possible for school children and all residents to walk and move safely through our community.

2018 CHRISTMAS TREE PICKUP PROGRAM

The annual Christmas Tree Recycling Program will begin January 2, 2018 and conclude January 12, 2018. Residents are asked to place their trees at the curb prior to 7:00 AM on January 2nd. Trees must be free of decorations, wire and lights, and may not be placed in plastic bags. Wreaths and evergreen garland will not be accepted. Trees will be recycled into wood chips.



HOLIDAY LIGHTS RECYCLING PROGRAM 2017-18

Prairieland Disposal's Holiday Light Recycling Program will begin December 1, 2017 and end January 31, 2018. There will be two locations available Monday through Friday. One of the drop-off sites will be located at the Public Works Facility, 1415 Industrial Drive from 7:00 am through 3:30 pm. The other drop-off site will be at the Municipal Center, 333 S. Green Street from 8:00 am through 5:00 pm. Acceptable lights are mini-lights (Italian lights), C7 lights, C9 lights, rope lights, LED lights, extension cords etc. All colors and lengths will be accepted. Garland, live greens, wreaths or other non-recyclable are not accepted in the program.
